- 13. Be willing to admit your mistakes.
- 14. We all have weaknesses (determine your weakness and work on it).
- 15. Be a good listener.
- 16. Cooperate with the official's organization.
- 17. Don't forget older officials.
- 18. Enjoy yourself and try to get better every game.
