

## **Officiating Philosophy for Successful Crews**

- 1. Get prepared mentally & physically before the season. Stay prepared throughout the season. Get in the book!
- 2. A good official keeps his cool, when those around him are losing theirs.
- 3. Get the obvious... See everything you call, but don't call everything you see. Don't be too technical... Let 'em play!
- 4. Don't reach for your flag unless you intend to toss it. Get a number! Keep officiating! Remember, when you toss a flag on the field, you & your crew's integrity are at stake.
- 5. Do <u>not</u> throw support flags, or blow support whistles... flag it only if you see it.
- 6. Always see the ball before blowing the whistle... avoid inadvertent whistles.
- 7. Bean bag fumbles... Know that it is a loose ball, don't guess! Be a good "dead ball" official... keep players in view until they are out of jeopardy.
- 8. Use preventive officiating when possible... Don't coach. Don't try to "make-up" for a bad call... Use that feeling as incentive to work harder... Be ready for the next call. Don't look for a call... Let them come to you.
- 9. Crisp ball movement on dead balls... Keep it off the ground. Show "it", then throw "it".
- 10. Count players <u>every</u> down. All crew members.
- 11. No committee meetings... Don't congregate on dead balls.
- 12. Hustle... Don't hurry. And don't walk!
- 13. Communicate with courtesy... Treat coaches & players with respect.
- 14. Stay focused for 48 minutes (plus OT, if necessary). Keep your crewmates focused.
